Suffolk County Council's Farms



The County Farms Estate - Future direction Some key points

- Informs policy until 2029
- Run the estate commercially
- Complement council's strategic priorities
 - Economic growth
 - Social capital
 - Greenest county
 - Sites for new development
- Commercially focused
 - commercial approach to promoting potential development sites (residential, commercial and industrial), to include renewable energy projects, and to work with tenants and partners, including District and Parish Councils where appropriate
 - Farm Diversification...promote tenant-led diversification (subject to a suitable business plan
- ...supporting additional public access
- ...actively endorsed Care Farm initiatives...and will continue to do so.
- ...promote and support alternative (green) energy solutions
- ...to manage existing and to plant new woodland...
- ...promote use of environmental land management to improve both biodiversity and permissive access
